*ORDER OF TRANSFER TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS*

Counsel for the State Bar of Nevada and attorney Colin Bringhurst have jointly petitioned this court for an order transferring Bringhurst to disability inactive status. Bringhurst and his counsel have signed the joint petition. The parties stipulate that Bringhurst is presently incapacitated under the terms of SCR 117 from continuing to practice law and from adequately defending himself against pending disciplinary charges.


Having reviewed the petition and its attachments, we conclude that the relief requested in the joint petition is warranted under the circumstances. Accordingly, Colin Bringhurst is transferred to disability inactive status. Bringhurst may resume the active practice of law only after he has complied with SCR 117(4) and (5).<sup>1</sup> In light of this order, any pending disciplinary proceedings against Bringhurst are suspended. The State Bar shall effect notice of this order as required






under SCR 121.1. Bar counsel shall provide this court with proof that notice has been served.


It is so ORDERED.<sup>2</sup>


