ORDER OF DISBARMENT BY CONSENT

The Southern Nevada Disciplinary Board has submitted, under SCR 112, a petition for attorney Lawrence J. Davidson's disbarment by consent. The petition is supported by Davidson's affidavit, stating that he freely and voluntarily consents to disbarment, after having had the opportunity to consult with counsel. Davidson acknowledges in the affidavit that he has engaged in many instances of serious misconduct, including forgery, falsification of a court order, and misappropriation of over \$800,000 from his clients, and that he could not successfully defend against the two disciplinary complaints pending against him.

SCR 112 provides that an attorney who is the subject of a proceeding involving allegations of misconduct may consent to disbarment by delivering an affidavit to the appropriate disciplinary board, which must file it with this court. Davidson's affidavit meets the requirements of SCR 112(1), and we conclude that the petition should be granted. Accordingly, Davidson is disbarred. The provisions of SCR 115 governing
