



The 120-day 79th legislative session began on February 6, 2017. At the time of the writing of this article, 793 bill draft requests, more commonly known as “BDRs” in legislative parlance, have been submitted to the Legislative Counsel’s office for drafting. Pursuant to NRS 218D.150, after the session convenes, each Assembly member will have one additional bill draft request, and each senator will have an additional two bill draft requests. These additional legislator bill draft requests must be submitted on or before the 8th calendar day of the Legislative Session (February 13).

LEGISLATIVE PREVIEW

Prefiled Bills

New this legislative session is a statutory requirement that legislators prefile (or face withdrawing) some of their bill draft requests prior to the start of the legislative session. (NRS 218D.150(2)) Prefiling is a process allowing for the printing of a bill prior to the legislative session beginning. Incumbent Assembly members must prefile at least four of the bill drafts they were allowed to request prior to the legislative session or withdraw an equal number of BDRs.

Incumbent Senate members must prefile at least eight of the bill drafts they were allowed to request prior to the legislative session, or withdraw an equal number of BDRs. Newly elected Assembly members must prefile two of the requests they were allotted prior to the legislative session, and each newly elected senator must prefile four of the requests allotted to them prior to the legislative session (or withdraw an equal number of BDRs, respectively). In addition, the governor and the constitutional officers (NRS 218D.175), the Supreme Court (NRS 218D. 190), local governments (NRS 218D.205) and local government associations (NRS 218D.210) are also allotted a number of bill draft requests. With the exception of bills necessary to implement the budget, these bills are also required to be prefiled. This has resulted in many more bills already having been prefiled, as noted by an Assembly Bill (AB) or Senate Bill (SB) number included on the bill drafts requests listed in this article. This process will mean a much quicker and busier pace at the beginning of the 2017 legislative session than in sessions past.

Pursuant to NRS 218D.150(5), committee chairs or designees could also request a limited number of bill drafts prior to the general election last year. One of the first actions to be taken by the Legislature will be the adoption of the Joint Rules of the Assembly and Senate, which traditionally provide that, in addition to the bill draft requests already submitted, an allotment of additional bill draft requests (60 were allowed during the last legislative session) will be allocated to each house for division among their standing committees. A standing committee may only request the drafting of a bill or resolution, or introduce a bill or resolution that is within the jurisdiction of the standing committee.

Legislative leadership also has an allotment of bill draft requests. The Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the Assembly may each have requested 15 legislative measures prior to the 2016 general election. (NRS 218D.155) The minority leaders of the Assembly and the Senate may each have requested 10 legislative measures prior to the 2016 general election. (NRS 218D.155) The Chair of the Legislative Commission

and the Chair of the Interim Finance Committee are both allowed 10 bill draft requests approved by their committees prior to the legislative session. (NRS 218D.160) Traditionally, pursuant to the Joint Standing Rules for the Senate and Assembly adopted by the Legislature at the beginning of each legislative session, the Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the Assembly during the legislative session may each submit to the Legislative Counsel, on his or her own behalf or on the behalf of another legislator or a standing committee of the Senate or Assembly, not more than five additional requests for the drafting of a bill or resolution. Similarly, the Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the Assembly may each submit during the legislative session, not more than two additional requests for the drafting of a bill or resolution.

The following is a list of those BDRs, divided by general subject, which will be of interest to the general membership of the bar. The bill draft request list sets forth the general subject of each bill draft request and the requester's name. The subject matter is often very vague. For example, there are bill draft requests relating to criminal law and criminal procedures that are vaguely and broadly described as "revises provisions regarding criminal law and criminal procedure," "revises provisions relating to crimes" and "revises provisions governing criminal defendants." To learn more details regarding the specific contents of such

a bill draft request, the public may contact the requester of the bill, or wait to see if the bill draft is prefiled or introduced as a bill during the legislative session and read its content.

2017 Bill Draft Requests

A number preceding the dash in the BDR description, for example 14-113, designates that Title 14 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (Procedure in Criminal Cases) has been identified by the Legislative Counsel's Office as encompassing the main subject of the bill draft. The number following the dash is simply the number assigned to the BDR, in accordance with the order it was added to the BDR list. The letter "C" appearing before a bill draft number denotes the bill draft request is for a joint resolution amending the Nevada Constitution.

Some bill drafts were requested by legislators who are no longer serving in the Legislature. In such cases, the original requestor may authorize a legislator who will be serving during the legislative session to become the primary sponsor of the legislative measure (individually or as a Chair of a Committee). If the serving legislator agrees to become the primary sponsor, that legislative measure is then counted as a request of the serving legislator or of the serving legislator's committee. (NRS 218D.130) As noted above, some BDRs have already been prefiled as legislative bills. In that instance, the house of introduction ("AB" for Assembly Bill or "SB" for Senate Bill) and bill number for the measures follows the BDR number. A personalized bill tracking device is also available free of charge for a maximum of 10 BDRs or bills at: <https://www.leg.state.nv.us/App/NELIS/REL/79th2017/Pft>. While the same information is available on the legislative website, the personalized legislative tracking device automatically tracks bills. A charge is imposed for tracking more than 10 BDRs or bills on the personalized bill tracking device.


