## CATHERINE KAY RAMSEY

Catherine Kay (Shanks-Harris) Ramsey passed away January 18, 2021. She was 56.

Ramsey was born September 23, 1964, in Fairborn, Ohio, to Nancy (Connot) and Terrill Shanks. As a child, she traveled extensively, as her father was in the U.S. Air Force. The family made Las Vegas their home in 1977. She graduated from Valley High School in 1982 and received her associate degree from Clark County Community College. She worked as a paralegal with the dream of attending law school. She attained her dream and graduated from the University of Nevada Las Vegas, Boyd School of Law and was licensed to practice law in Nevada in 2002.

Ramsey was elected to the North Las Vegas Municipal Court in 2011, the first female to hold that position. She was an active member of the State Bar of Nevada.

### WILLIAM "BILL" TERRY

William "Bill" Terry passed away January 15, 2021. He was 74.

Terry was a Bishop Gorman High School and University of Nevada, Las Vegas, graduate who earned his law degree from the University of San Diego.

Terry started his career in 1973 as a federal prosecutor before becoming a criminal defense attorney who represented politicians, judges and fellow lawyers, among others, during a career that lasted nearly five decades.

Early in his career, Terry was an alternate judge in Las Vegas Municipal Court. He was a member and chairman of the State Bar of Nevada's Disciplinary Board. In 1997, he earned the Clark County Bar Association's Professionalism Award.
